Instructions for DIY Sock Bunny:

- 1) Pour into the sock about 2/3 of the rice, making sure all the rice sits at the bottom of the sock.
- 2) With a piece of white yarn, tie off the rice at the top of the pile of rice inside the toe of the sock. Shape the rice into a roundish circle for the bunny's body.
- 3) Pour into the sock the remainder of the rice to form the head of the bunny.
- 4) Insert each eye into the sock about 3/4" to 1" below the top of the rice pile from where you would like the bunny's eyes to sit. Fasten each eye on the inside of the sock with one of the rubber closures and cover with rice.
- 5) With the remainder of the white yarn, tie off the head formed by the remainder of the rice.
- 6) Cut a vertical straight line from the very top of the sock all the way down to the top of the head, aiming towards the middle of the forehead (centered between the eyes of the bunny).
- 7) Exactly opposite of the vertical cut just made (i.e., back of the bunny's head), cut another vertical straight line all the way down to the top of the bunny's head. This will become the bunny's floppy ears.
- 8) With the scissors, shape the bunny's ears to your liking, leaving them flopping to the side of the bunny's head.
- 9) Take the three pieces of jute, and line them up so that the ends of each piece "match." Gather the jute at the exact center, and glue to where you want the bunny's nose to sit on the bunny's face.
- 10) Glue the nose (small pom-pom) on top of the center of the whiskers.
- 11) Take the piece of lace ribbon, and glue to the body of the bunny so that the two ends form a V-shape at the center back of the bunny, with the front of the lace circling a bit below the neck of the bunny towards the back.
- 12) Create a bow with the colored ribbon, and glue to the top of the bunny's head.
- 13) Glue the large flower to the center of the bow.
- 14) Glue the three small flowers to the lace ribbon circling the bunny's body.
