





#### LIVING HISTORY: CAMP LIFE DURING THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR

Soldiers in Washington's Army spent nearly eight years of conflict facing off against the British and living in makeshift camps all over the country. This FREE hands-on program – led by Joe Ryan, Founder and President of the Living History Education Foundation, and experienced BOCES-certified re-enactors – will highlight the tasks of ordinary camp life during the war. Participants will divide into platoons, lay out an encampment, put up an 18th-century tent, and drill with bang & flash muskets. PLEASE NOTE there is LIMITED REGISTRATION for this event! Children age 8+ and all adults welcome. This program isn't suitable for young children. This program will take place both indoors and outdoors, if weather permits.
