You may use your own equipment to access the internet at the Library if you have a device with a wireless connection. Most users can simply bring their wireless-enabled device to the Library and turn it on. The device should automatically recognize the network. If it does not, check with the Reference Librarian to verify the wireless network is functioning.

Wireless access is available in the parking lot, on the grounds and in the building.
